## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The managers and staff team are aware of their duty to safeguard children. They are confident in the signs and indicators of abuse, and fully understand the procedures to follow if they have any child protection concerns and what to do if they had an allegation of a member of staff.
- The managers and staff team carry out visual checks and risk assessments on the premises, activities and equipment used by all children. This helps to identify and reduce the risk of potential hazards to children.
- The managers and staff team know how to positively manage children's behaviour. There are shared rules to help children understand expectations for their behaviour.
- Staff plan a varied day for the children with activities that help motivate and interest them. The managers and staff team understand the importance of having good partnerships with parents and other professionals involved in children's care. This helps staff understand and meet children's individual needs.
- Managers recognise the need to evaluate their provision. For example, they understand the importance of offering staff ongoing training opportunities to enhance and support their professional development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the setting.
- The inspector viewed all areas of the premises used by the club.
- A sample of documentation was viewed by the inspector, including children's records, staff qualifications and staff suitability.
- The inspector spoke to managers and staff about how they safeguard children and meet the individual needs of the children.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
