

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 10 August 2023, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted.

On 15 August 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 29 August 2023:

- ensure that staffing arrangements and staff deployment meet the needs of all children and ensure their safety
- ensure that risk assessments inform staff practice so that risks are identified and managed in order to keep children safe
- ensure arrangements are in place to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

On 5 September 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The provider had improved how staff are deployed to meet the individual needs of children. The provider had improved risk assessment procedures, including re-training staff on how to identify and manage any possible risks to children. The provider had improved the arrangements for supporting children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action



We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.
