

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 July 2023, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 21 August 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 11 September 2023:

- ensure all those working with children have a thorough knowledge and understanding of how to safeguard children and are able to identify those children who may be at risk of harm, including children who may be at risk of radicalisation or extreme behaviours.
- ensure that the safeguarding policy is in line with guidance and procedures relevant to the local safeguarding children's partnerships (LSCP).

On 11 September 2023, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of safeguarding procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
