

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 July 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 14 July 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 28 July 2023:

- ensure that leaders accurately identify weaknesses in staff's practice and provide targeted support to help them to improve in these areas
- ensure the key person system is effective at supporting every individual child's care and learning needs
- ensure that staff are always deployed effectively so that they provide safe supervision for all children
- ensure that children's sleeping arrangements are safe
- develop leaders and staff understanding of risk so that they can identify and mitigate risks as much as possible.

On 31 July 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had improved arrangements for supervision of staff so that weaknesses in staff development were being addressed through support, coaching and training. They had reviewed the key person system to ensure that staff support children's individual care and learning needs effectively. The provider had reviewed the deployment of staff to ensure all children are supervised effectively. They had reviewed sleeping arrangements for young children to improve safety. The provider had improved the approach to risk assessments for the setting.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
