#### Information about this children's home

This home is privately owned. It is registered to provide care for up to four children of the same gender who may have social and emotional difficulties.

There is currently no registered manager in post. The manager currently working in the home has not yet submitted her application to register with Ofsted.

### This monitoring visit

This home was judged inadequate at the full inspection on 25 and 26 July 2023. Following this inspection, two compliance notices were issued under section 22A of the Care Standards Act 2000. These compliance notices were in relation to regulation 12 (the protection of children standard) and regulation 13 (the leadership and management standard).

The purpose of this monitoring visit was to review the actions taken by the provider to meet the compliance notices. Ofsted found that the provider had not taken sufficient action to meet these compliance notices.

The manager was absent from the home at the time of the visit. The home is being overseen by the responsible individual and regional manager in her absence. Since this oversight has been in place, some progress has been made.

Since the full inspection, the provider has made improvements to the home environment. This includes the repair of damage to the home and full redecoration.

Most staff have undertaken training specific to the needs of the children who live in the home. However, not all staff, including the manager, have had the opportunity to

complete this. This means that staff are not provided with the leadership and guidance to provide care to the children in line with the home's statement of purpose. Shortfalls were identified at the visit in staff's understanding of children's individual vulnerabilities and needs.

The home is not fully staffed. Several staff have left since the inspection, including the deputy manager. This means that the children are not cared for by a stable and consistent staff team.

The monitoring of the home is not effective. Children's records have not been updated or reviewed in a timely manner. Action has not been taken to ensure that staff are reading, reviewing and understanding children's plans.

Some action has been taken to identify shortfalls in staff knowledge and understanding. A competency tracker has highlighted significant shortfalls in staff understanding of their roles and responsibilities. Sufficient action has not been taken to address these shortfalls.

The remaining requirements are repeated from the last inspection, as these were not reviewed as part of this monitoring visit.

Ofsted made the decision to reissue compliance notices under regulation 12 (the protection of children standard) and regulation 13 (the leadership and management standard). Ofsted will monitor the provider's compliance with these notices.

In particular, leaders and managers should ensure that children are consulted about the care that they receive and contribute to decisions that affect their lives.

The registered person must ensure that—	20 October 2023
within 24 hours of the use of a measure of control, discipline or restraint in relation to a child in the home, a record is made which includes—	
the effectiveness and any consequences of the use of the measure; and	
a description of any injury to the child or any other person, and any medical treatment administered, as a result of the measure;	
within 5 days of the use of the measure, the registered person or the authorised person adds to the record confirmation that they have spoken to the child about the measure.  (Regulation 35 (3)(a)(vii)(viii)(c))	
Leaders and managers must ensure that children are spoken to specifically about the measure used.	
The registered person must maintain records ("case records") for each child which— include the information and documents listed in Schedule 3 in relation to each child;	20 October 2023
are kept up to date;	
are signed and dated by the author of each entry. (Regulation 36 (1)(a)(b)(c))	
The registered person must notify HMCI and each other relevant person without delay if—	20 October 2023
there is an allegation of abuse against the home or a person working there. (Regulation 40 (4)(c))	





provide personalised care that meets each child's needs, as recorded in the child's relevant plans, taking account of the child's background.	
provide to children living in the home the physical necessities they need in order to live there comfortably.	
(Regulation 6 (2) (b) (iv) (vii)
