Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider, managers and staff understand their responsibilities with regards to keeping children safe. They regularly undertake appropriate training and inhouse meetings to help them to keep abreast of changes in safeguarding practice and procedures. The provider has clear procedures in place for referring safeguarding concerns to the appropriate authority and the action to take when allegations are made against staff.
- Staff provide an interesting range of resources, games and sports equipment to help children to engage in purposeful play. The setting has use of the school outdoor play equipment. Staff encourage children to enjoy the outdoor facilities daily where possible.
- Parents spoken to during the inspection speak highly of the staff and comment how much their children like to attend the out-of-school setting. They state that their children like the staff and form close relationships with them.
- Staff and managers work closely with the host school and parents to ascertain a good understanding of children's interests, likes and dislikes. Where possible, staff complement the learning taking place during the school day with similar activities or books.
- The provider has robust recruitment procedures in place to ensure that new staff are appropriately vetted and their suitability is checked. Regular supervision meetings ensure staff are coached and supported to do their job well.
- Staff understand how to manage children's behaviour in a positive way. They have clear boundaries and rules within the out-of-school provision that they help children to learn and follow.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
