Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of child development. She intends to provide children with a child-led curriculum that supports them to develop their independence. The childminder discusses how she will use an online app to monitor children's progress and share this with the parents. She explains how she will also use this information to ensure that any concerns are dealt with in a timely manner. The childminder regularly attends online training and courses to keep her knowledge of the early years up to date.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents. She explains how she intends to support this relationship through consistent communication. For example, the childminder describes how she will share photos and videos with parents throughout the time that children are with her. She also explains that she will give verbal feedback when parents collect their children.
- The childminder has a good understanding of keeping children safe. She regularly attends mandatory training in first aid and safeguarding. The childminder is able to explain the possible signs and symptoms of abuse. She explains the procedures she will follow should she have any concerns about any of the children.
- The childminder has a large range of resources and activities. She explains how she intends to support children and their different stages of their development through her planning and activities. The childminder discusses her plans to take children on trips, such as to the local park, zoo and library, to further enhance their learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour. She explains how she intends to provide the children with a warm and inclusive environment to promote this.
- The childminder explains how she will support children with transitions. For example, she explains she will work closely with parents when children are ready to start toilet training.
- The childminder discusses how she intends to support children to make healthy choices. She explains that she will plan and make healthy meals for children and include them in the cooking process. The childminder describes how she will ensure that children's allergies and intolerances are taken into account.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
