Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Staff are well trained to care for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. They explain how they develop positive, trusting relationships with children to help them feel safe and secure at the setting. Leaders and staff also understand the importance of working closely with parents and other agencies. This is so that they have a deep knowledge of children's emotional and developmental needs.
- Staff demonstrate through discussion how they keep children safe. They collect detailed information about each child's health and medical needs and follow robust procedures to ensure that each child receives the care that they need.
- Staff have a good understanding of the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and know how to report any concerns they may have about the welfare of a child. Throughout discussions, they demonstrate their clear understanding of how to protect and safeguard children.
- Leaders explain the robust procedures that are in place to help monitor and develop staff performance. This includes daily reflective meetings, supervisory meetings and targeted training to help to meet the specific needs of children.
- Leaders and staff understand how to support children's behaviour positively. For example, they explain how they help children to develop social skills so that they enjoy positive relationships with their peers.
- The provider has recently failed to notify Ofsted in a timely manner of a significant matter relating to an allegation against staff. However, leaders have taken prompt and effective action. Staff have received detailed training in the setting's whistle-blowing policy and now have a comprehensive understanding of the procedures to follow if they have a concern about a colleague. Leaders now also have procedures in place to ensure they take swift action in the event of any future allegations.
- Leaders are highly reflective of their practice at the setting and discuss how selfevaluation helps drive improvements to the setting. As a result, staff receive bespoke training, which is tailored to the unique needs of the children attending, to enhance the quality of their practice. Leaders report that through their evaluations and observation of staff's interactions, they see greater engagement in activities and measurable, improved outcomes for them.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
