Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The manager has the required policies and procedures in place for children's safety, including managing accidents. Sufficient staff hold paediatric first-aid qualifications. Leaders follow safe recruitment processes to check the suitability of staff.
- The manager and staff understand how to make the premises safe and suitable for children. They know how to evacuate children in the event of a fire and keep the premises secure, so that no unauthorised person can gain access to the rooms used by children.
- The manager understands the need to evaluate the provision. She prioritises safeguarding as part of the staff's ongoing professional development and provides them with opportunities to extend their knowledge and skills.
- The manager and staff understand about a range of signs and symptoms that may indicate a child is at risk of harm. They know how to report concerns about a child or colleague.
- The manager understands the importance of developing partnerships with parents and other professionals. She describes how she links with schools to help provide continuity for children's care when needed.
- The manager understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating, having access to drinks, being physically active and spending time outdoors.
- The manager explains how she considers children's interest and age to help plan a range of activities. This includes making adjustments to the play areas for children's individual needs.
- The manager discusses their expectations for children's behaviour. She is clear about how she will help children to develop positive relationships and understand the expectations for their behaviour at the club.
- The manager gives careful consideration to how they can provide an inclusive service for all children, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
