

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2.

If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 18 October 2023, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 30 October 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued an action for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. Action needed by 27 November 2023:

- provide staff with continuing professional development that enables them to support children's positive behaviour effectively.

On 27 November 2023, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider had delivered training for staff to help them develop strategies to support children's behaviour. Additionally, managers had reviewed and evaluated the impact of this training on staff practise.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
