

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the¿Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at ¿www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 December 2023, the provider notified us that there had been an incident regarding medication at the setting. This notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' to notify Ofsted of any serious accident, injury or illness to a child.

On 22 December 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit and found that there had been breaches to some of these requirements. However, the provider had already taken action to address this by:

- improving the medication policy and procedures
- addressing staff supervision of children.

We are satisfied with the actions that the provider has taken to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to



bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
