Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The manager understands that staff will set up activities with a focus on the prime areas of learning. For example, she discusses they will provide a selection of books to help develop early language skills. The manager describes how staff will use action rhymes and dance to support children's gross motor skill development.
- The manager explains how staff gather information from parents. She describes how staff use this information to ensure that children's care preferences are shared with the team, to help settle the children quickly.
- The manager recognises that children can struggle when dropped off with no transition period. The manager provides examples of how staff support children with their emotions and behaviour during the session. They name emotions and talk about feelings.
- The manager discusses the importance of providing healthy fruit snacks and water and discussing the importance of healthy eating and encouraging children to make healthy choices, through reading books and role play.
- The manager describes how she supports staff with their well-being and professional development. She discusses that group supervisions take place where staff reflect on the week and plan for the children who attend each session.
- The manager understands the importance of training the staff team to stay updated in safeguarding training and describes the signs of abuse and how staff identify children who may be a risk. She explains how staff are aware of their roles and responsibilities to report and record any concerns.
- The manager discusses the recruitment processes and ongoing suitability checks are regular to ensure that staff working with children are suitable.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The manager and the inspector discussed how the practitioner organises their early years provision, including the aims and rationale for their early years foundation stage curriculum for the prime areas of learning.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation and reviewed evidence of the suitability of staff working in the setting.
- The inspector talked to staff at appropriate times during the inspection and took account of their views.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
