Overall outcome

The school is likely to meet the relevant independent school standards if the material change relating to the school provision is implemented

Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7 to 7(b), 11, 12, 14, 16 to 16(b), 32(1), 32(1)(c)

- The school's culture of safeguarding continues to be strong. For example, leaders follow up on and record concerns quickly and appropriately. Pupils spoken with feel safe at school. Leaders understand their statutory responsibilities, including those outlined in the latest 'Keeping children safe in education' (September 2023) guidance. The school's safeguarding policy reflects this guidance and is available online.
- Leaders have thought through the health, safety and risk implications of opening an additional classroom. Policies and risk assessments suitably consider how to minimise and mitigate any possible risks. The new classroom has been equipped with fire safety call points, extinguishers and emergency lighting.
- Leaders have suitable plans to employ additional staff before admitting new pupils.
- The independent school standards (the standards) checked in part 3 are likely to continue to be met if the material change is approved and implemented.

Part 4. Suitability of staff, supply staff, and proprietors

All paragraphs

- Arrangements for the recruitment, induction and training of staff are suitable. The single central record contains an accurate record of all the required vetting checks on the adults responsible for, and working at, the school.
- The standards in part 4 are likely to continue to be met if the material change is approved and implemented.

Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

All paragraphs

■ An additional classroom area has been refurbished to a high standard. Arrangements



for the area's lighting and acoustics are likely to be suitable. The additional space is likely to comfortably accommodate an additional six pupils. An additional toilet and washing facility has also been created. New pupils will access the same suitable medical room, changing and shower facilities as existing pupils. Labelled drinkingwater supplies are available throughout the premises. The hot water supply is safely regulated. There is ample outdoor space for recreation and physical education.

■ The standards in part 5 are likely to continue to be met if the material change is approved and implemented.

Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

- The school's leaders have planned suitably for this material change. Leaders demonstrate a continued secure understanding of the standards.
- The standard in part 8 is likely to continue to be met if the material change is approved and implemented.

The school is likely to meet the requirements of the schedule to the Education (Independent School Standards) Regulations 2014 ('the independent school standards') and associated requirements that are relevant to the material change.

- The school is part of, and governed by, Outcomes First Group.
- The school makes no use of alternative provision.
- The school's most recent inspection was a graded inspection in November 2023.



Information about this inspection

- The Department for Education commissioned this inspection to consider the school's application to increase the number of pupils it admits.
- This was the first inspection to consider the school's material change application.
- The inspection was announced with two days' notice.
- The inspector considered whether the relevant requirements in parts 3, 4, 5 and 8 of the standards are likely to continue to be met if the material change is approved.
- The inspector met with a range of senior leaders, including the headteacher, the deputy headteacher and the chair of the proprietor body. He toured the premises, including the new classroom area, and met with a group of pupils. He considered a range of evidence, including documents relating to health and safety, risk assessment and fire safety. The inspection also considered the school's safeguarding arrangements, including checks on the single central record.
