Information about this children's home

The home is run by a private provider that specialises in delivering services for children with autism spectrum disorder, learning disabilities and complex needs. The home provides care for up to five children. Four children were living at the home at the time of the inspection.

The manager registered with Ofsted in April 2021.

This monitoring visit

At the previous full inspection, this home was judged to be inadequate. As a result, compliance notices were issued. A monitoring visit took place on 19 December 2023. However, the manager had not taken all the necessary steps to meet the compliance notices. Further compliance notices were issued under regulation 13, the leadership and management standard, and under regulation 35, the behaviour management policies and records standard.

There have been two incidents of restraint since the last visit. The restraint records have been reviewed by the manager, who concluded that the holds were appropriate and used in line with legislation. The manager has identified any recording issues and addressed these with staff to ensure that they have only used restraints that they are trained in and have agreement to do so.

Children are spoken to following any incidents or the use of restraint. When children are not able to engage, staff ensure that children are appropriately monitored after the incident to ensure their well-being. Additionally, staff use different methods depending on the children's communication needs, including the use of symbols and social stories.

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There has been one consequence recorded. This was restorative in nature and was understood by the child. The manager had evaluated the record to ensure the consequence was reviewed for its effectiveness.

Since the last monitoring visit, there has been an allegation made by a child against a staff member. Although this allegation was retracted, it was not reported to the local authority designated officer. The manager has not had appropriate oversight of this incident and has failed to identify staff shortfalls. Action was taken to address this when discussed at this monitoring visit.

The manager now has monthly clinical review meetings with others in the organisation, including the clinical lead. This means that information can be reviewed and monitored as a group to improve oversight.

The manager has arranged several development programmes for the staff to support them in their role, including training for the full staff team and additional training for the senior staff. The staff also have a competency assessment booklet around behaviour support, which will be reviewed and assessed in supervision sessions.

The manager has plans to further strengthen support systems for staff and her monitoring of the home. These plans include additional on call support, identified shift leaders and senior manager oversight when the manager is not present.

Overall, the manager has made good progress in developing her monitoring and review systems. However, further work is required to ensure that the changes are embedded and sustained. The compliance notices have been met. However, a requirement has been made under the leadership and management standard. This will be reviewed at the next full inspection.
