

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 28 February 2024, the provider notified us that a child entered an unsecured part of the premises and was out of sight and hearing of staff. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early years provider to look after children.

On 11 March 2024, we carried out a regulatory video call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has conducted a full investigation into the incident. All staff have attended meetings and received individual staff supervisions to ensure that they understand their responsibility to deploy themselves effectively so that children are within sight or sound and adequately supervised. The provider has added an additional outdoor gate to the side of the premises and made amendments to how children are dropped off and collected at the nursery. This further ensures the safety of the premises. The policy for collecting children and risk assessments for the use of the garden area have been reviewed, updated and shared with all staff to ensure they understand the new arrangements to keep children safe. Additionally, all staff have attended updated safeguarding training. Furthermore, the provider has created risk assessments tailored to meet the individual needs of children with special education needs and/or disabilities. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
