Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates how she will promote a respectful and positive culture. For instance, she describes how she will encourage children's positive behaviour and value their cultures and beliefs. The provider says she will support all children to respect one another, behave well and promote British values.
- The provider understands the importance of promoting children's good health and physical exercise. She describes how staff will provide a wide range of exciting outdoor experiences, such as basketball, football, a mud kitchen and tricycles for younger children. The provider explains how this will help to promote children's physical skills and imaginations.
- The provider recognises the importance of providing an inclusive service to ensure that all families are welcome, particularly those children who may not have the same experiences as others. She explains how staff plan a wide range of experiences and outings. For example, the provider explains how staff organise trips to museums, bowling and swimming to help to promote children's sense of community.
- The provider keeps her safeguarding knowledge current. She ensures that all staff understand their safeguarding responsibility. Staff access training to help them to identify and respond to signs of possible abuse and neglect, particularly within the local area. The provider correctly explains the local procedures for reporting her concerns, including allegations made against staff.
- The provider evaluates the quality of the service which the club provides, and explains how she strives for continuous improvement. For example, she seeks the views of children to help to involve them in the planning of activities. The provider asks parents for their views to help to ensure that children receive quality play experiences and have lots of fun when they attend the club.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

It operates during some school holidays, from 8am until 6pm, Monday to Friday. There are six members of staff employed in the club. Of these, four staff hold play work certificates at level 3.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the club received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the club.
- The inspector viewed the provision and the provider discussed the safety and suitability of the premises.
- The inspector met with the provider and discussed the leadership and management of the club.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation and reviewed evidence of the suitability of staff working at the club.
- The provider and the inspector discussed how staff organise the environment and plan suitable experiences for different ages of children.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
