

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 March 2024, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. On 14 March 2024, the provider notified us about an incident that had happened at the setting in February 2024.

On 19 March 2024, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. They reviewed staff training, reflected on their whistleblowing policy and refreshed staff's knowledge of how to appropriately deal with any challenging behaviour. However, we identified that the provider failed to notify Ofsted of a significant event, which is a requirement of their registration. The provider will be able to give parents more information about this. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
