

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can fine at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 October 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 2 November 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 14 November 2023, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had started to take steps to address the actions. However, new procedures were not fully embedded, and the impact could not be seen.

On 5 February 2024, we carried out a further regulatory visit. We found that staff, including leaders and those with oversight and governance of the setting are aware of their roles and responsibilities. The key-person system is improved, and children's needs are better supported. Staff are aware of and are meeting children's dietary requirements effectively. The hygiene and cleanliness of the setting has improved.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
