## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates that she is committed to providing a high-quality and welcoming environment, where children feel safe, happy and secure.
- The provider understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She has a clear knowledge of the procedures to follow and the appropriate agencies to report any concerns to about children's welfare, including allegations. She knows the importance of supervising children and to ensure effective risk assessments are in place.
- The provider demonstrates an awareness of the importance of creating an environment that meets the needs of all children, including those with special educational needs and or disabilities.
- She understands the importance of promoting children's health and encouraging healthy habits and lifestyle. She discusses ways she will help children to be active. For example, encouraging children to participate in a wide range of physical activities, such as outdoor games. She is aware of the importance of helping children to understand the significance of hygiene routines. She describes how she will prepare healthy and balanced meals and encourage children to follow dental care routines.
- The provider explains the methods that she will use to support children's positive behaviour. She demonstrates how she will help children to feel valued and respected. She will acknowledge what children have done well or try to achieve, with praise. She will help children to understand right from wrong, respect for others. There will be clear guidance with regards to rules and boundaries, so children understand behavioural expectations and feel safe. The provider speaks about being a role model and helping children to understand the language of feelings to support their emotions.
- The provider recognises the importance of supporting children to be independent and confident. She will encourage them to share their views and join in group discussions. She explains that children will choose what they want to play with by encouraging them to join in planning with staff.
- The provider understands the importance of working with parents and other provisions, such as schools that children attend, to ensure consistency of care. She describes how she will enhance children's experiences by extending projects that they have been participating in or learning about in school.
- The provider recognises the importance of maintaining her professional development and regularly updating her knowledge and training. She ensures all the necessary documentations are kept updated. The provider describes how she will evaluate her provision to ensure children have the best possible experience in her care.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
