

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 March 2024, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.

On 21 March 2024, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 16 April 2024, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 23 April 2024:

- notify local child protection agencies of any serious accident or injury to a child while in your care
- review risk assessments to ensure the environment where children play is checked regularly and risks are removed or minimised
- ensure staff are deployed effectively to meet the needs of all children and ensure their safety.

On 19 April 2024, the provider responded to the actions set. The provider confirmed they

have notified local child protection agencies of a serious accident. They have renewed their risk assessment of the environment and reduced the risk of trips and falls. The provider has made changes to the routines to ensure staff are deployed more effectively.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
