

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 30 April 2024, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 10 May 2024:

- ensure staffing arrangements meet the needs of all children and that they are adequately supervised at all times
- ensure risk assessment are robust and carried out by staff to ensure children are kept safe
- follow the settings policy and procedures, by notifying parents if a child goes missing.

On 13 May 2024, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found that the provider deploys staff effectively to ensure children are supervised adequately at all times. The provider has improved their risk assessment to keep children safe and has trained staff to ensure they understand the setting's procedures in this regard. Also, the provider has improved their knowledge and understanding of the setting's missing child policy. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
