

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 June 2024, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection we served a welfare requirements notice on 20 June 2024. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 1 July 2024:

- ensure that all staff working with children have attended training that provides them with knowledge and understanding of safeguarding, specifically how to identify a child may be at risk of harm; what to do if staff are concerned about a child and the referral process if concerns are raised about children and/or staff members
- implement effective arrangements for supervision that identifies and addresses weakness in knowledge and understanding of staff and promotes the interests of children
- ensure that risk assessment is robust to minimise potential risks to children

On 2 July 2024, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last

inspection.

We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understating of safeguarding and their responsibilities in this regard. Staff had attended training to improve their knowledge and understanding of safeguarding and the procedures to follow to refer concerns about a child and/or staff member. The provider had revised supervision arrangements for staff to identify and address weaknesses in staff practice and to promote the interests of children being cared for. The provider has reviewed risk assessments and removed potential risks posed to children.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
