Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Staff demonstrate through discussion how they provide activities and experiences that complement children's learning from school. For example, staff share examples of how they support children to build upon their current skills through providing lots of opportunities for them to practise their learning from the classroom.
- The club has procedures in place to help support children's behaviour. Staff explain the range of strategies used to develop children's understanding of being caring towards their peers. They understand about role modelling positive behaviour to children. Staff intend for children to develop an understanding of right and wrong.
- Staff understand how to provide experiences to help children learn about different cultures and backgrounds. For example, staff value giving children opportunities to celebrate and talk about the different countries their families originated from.
- Staff demonstrate they understand about promoting children's physical health. They know the importance of providing children with healthy food options and access to fresh drinking water. They explain how they intend for children get fresh air as they walk from school to the club and trips to the local park, helping children to develop healthy lifestyles.
- Staff confidently explain the importance of working in partnership with parents and the schools the children attend. They demonstrate how they obtain information about the children in different ways, such as verbal communication, to support the needs of the children and develop an open culture of sharing information. This helps promote consistency for children.
- Staff have a good understanding of their role to keep children safe. They have clear policies and procedures in place and know who to contact should they have a concern regarding a child's welfare. Additionally, they know the appropriate steps to follow should an allegation be made against an adult working with the children. This helps to keep children safe.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the manager about the leadership and management of the setting.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation and reviewed evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.
- The manager provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
