## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The management team understand the importance of working in partnership with the host school and parents. They describe what information will be shared, including children's experiences at school and in the home, their individual needs and any concerns. This will help to promote a consistent approach to children's care and support.
- The staff know how to respond to accidents and emergencies. They hold current paediatric first-aid certificates, which helps them to keep children safe.
- The management team and staff know how to promote children's healthy lifestyles. For example, they explain how they will provide nutritious food choices and help children to understand the importance of healthy eating and oral health. Additionally, staff will plan a range of physical activities to help children to be active.
- The management team and staff know how to build positive relationships with children. They describe how they will respect children and use kind and nurturing interactions to help them feel valued and supported by staff.
- The management team and staff describe how they will help children to behave well. They will provide children with consistent and clear boundaries. Therefore, children will know the staff's expectations, helping them to feel secure. Staff will use praise and encouragement to acknowledge efforts and achievements to help promote children's self-esteem and sense of achievement.
- The management team has robust recruitment processes in place to ensure the safety and suitability of staff. They implement steps to ensure that staff continue to be suitable throughout their employment. This helps to safeguard children.
- Staff understand how to promote children's independence. They will encourage this through handwashing routines and children pouring drinks at snack time and hanging up their coats and bags.
- The management team and staff maintain a clean and secure environment. They carry out risk assessments of activities and the environment. This helps them to reduce potential risks to children and promotes their welfare.
- Staff understand the possible signs of abuse and the procedures to follow should they have any child protection concerns. They know what action to take should they have concerns about the behaviour and conduct of other adults working in the setting. This includes reporting concerns to the club's designated safeguarding lead and when to escalate concerns to the local authority designated offer.
- The management team describes how they will provide fun and interesting activities for children. This includes providing music, dance and yoga sessions, in addition to providing free play for children to select activities of interest to help them engage with and enjoy the activities on offer.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider has received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector and the manager had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and viewed the activities and equipment available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the managers and staff.
- The inspector held a meeting with the manager. She reviewed relevant documentation and evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the manager and how these will be implemented into practice.
- Although there were no children in the early age range present at the time of this inspection, there were children present who were over the age of five years.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
