## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider discussed how she intends to provide an appropriate curriculum for children and how she plans to evaluate children's development to help prepare them for the next stage in their learning. The provider understands her responsibility to ensure that staff implement an ambitious curriculum for all children for all children.
- The provider explained how she expects staff to manage children's behaviour, including how staff would encourage children's positive attitudes to learning through providing quality interactions.
- Children have access to outdoor play and exercise to help children to develop their physical skills. The provider intends to offer children healthy meals and snacks and to support children to lead a healthy lifestyle.
- A detailed action plan has been implemented and improvements have been made since the last inspection. For example, an appropriate procedure for staff support, coaching and training is in place. All activities have been risk assessed, sleeping routines have been changed and the provider has worked closely with the local authority who have offered some additional training for staff. This means that the provider understands her responsibility to continue to improve the overall quality of the setting.
- The provider understands her responsibility to work effectively in partnership with other professionals in order to meet children's individual care and learning needs, including children with special educational needs or disabilities.
- The provider also ensures there are procedures in place for effective working with parents. For example, she will ensure that information is shared with parents via an online platform. She intends to invite parents to parents evenings and 'stay and play sessions', which grandparents are also invited to.
- The provider intends to ensure that appropriate staff supervision arrangements are in place. She understands the importance of staff interactions being regularly reviewed to include a focus on the quality of interactions between staff and children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
