

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 16 August 2024, the provider notified us about changes that must be notified to Ofsted. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event.

On 21 August 2024, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 11 September 2024:

- implement robust recruitment processes consistently so that all staff undergo the required suitability checks prior to having unsupervised contact with children
- ensure an enhanced criminal records check is obtained for every adult working with children
- ensure all staff receive effective induction training, and ongoing support and guidance, to help them understand all aspects of their role and responsibilities.

On 17 September 2024, we visited the provider. The provider has improved the recruitment processes to ensure all adults working with children have the required suitability checks in place. They have updated the induction, training and support for all staff to ensure they fully understand their role and responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action



We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.
