## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The setting understands the importance of being reflective. It intends to obtain the views of parents and carers to help to identify areas for improvement. The setting aspires to offer children a play environment that oozes awe and wonder.
- The setting has a secure understanding of how it intends to offer children a broad play programme. It plans to complement children's care and play from school. It aims to keep parents informed of their children's achievements.
- The setting intends to teach children how to be kind and considerate towards others. It plans to ensure that staff provide clear expectations for children's behaviour. The setting aims to provide activities, such as meditation, to help children to regulate their own feelings and emotions.
- The setting has an excellent understanding of how it intends to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) and children who speak English as an additional language. It aims to work closely with parents and with external professionals to help children get the support that they need.
- The setting intends to teach children about similarities and differences between themselves and others. It knows how to offer an inclusive service. The setting plans to offer children first-hand experiences to learn about people and communities beyond their own. It proposes to help children to understand what it is like to live in modern Britain.
- The setting demonstrates a secure understanding of how it intends to offer staff a purposeful programme of professional development. It aims to support staff during supervision meetings to help them to improve their practice.
- The setting shows a good understanding of how it intends to teach children about healthy living. It aims to help children to develop healthy eating habits. The setting proposes to teach children about the importance of keeping physically active. It also plans to teach children about good oral health and why keeping well-hydrated is good for their bodies.
- The setting shows a good understanding of how it intends to keep children safe and protected from harm. It intends to train staff in child protection and to share safeguarding policies with them. The setting plans to ensure that there is an open culture of safeguarding.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
