Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders discuss how they plan to include a wide range of activities to complement children's learning at school. For example, they plan to provide children with daily activities, such as building with small bricks, group games and craft activities.
- Leaders understand children need the opportunity to be physically active and spend time outdoors every day. They plan to run clubs to develop children's physical endurance and create a love of exercise. For instance, activities such as boxing, dancing and gymnastics are planned to support the development of children's coordination, strength and balance.
- Leaders explain how they encourage children to adopt a healthy lifestyle and good hygiene routines. Snacks offered to children will be balanced and nutritious.
- Leaders have high expectations for children's behaviour. They explain how they will help children develop good social skills, build confidence and resilience. Positive behaviours will be promoted in the setting. They plan to use a reward system to support children to be kind, caring and courteous to one another.
- Leaders understand the importance of engaging with families. For example, they plan to organise events, such as a Christmas fair, and 'pizza parties' to learn how to make pizzas at a local Italian restaurant, to help promote a strong sense of community for children and their families.
- Leaders understand the importance of communicating with parents and plan to share information about their child on a daily basis.
- Leaders have a strong link with the host school and teachers. They plan to share information about the children's day to support the continuity of care for children who will transition from school to the setting.
- Leaders understand they need to give priority to staff well-being and will provide regular supervision sessions to support professional development.
- Leaders have clear oversight of the provision and are passionate about providing a club that is fun and inclusive. They place a strong emphasis on ensuring that children will be at the heart of everything they do. Leaders are committed to continual improvements and plan to share their policies with parents so that they are aware of the setting's procedures.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
