

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 19 December 2024, the provider notified us about health. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant event. On 20 December 2024, we also received a concern about health.

On 14 January 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right.

We found that the provider had strengthened and reinforced the procedures for supporting children's allergies and dietary needs at mealtimes. They have strengthened the risk assessment for checking food all items to ensure these are thoroughly checked by at least two trained members of staff before being used.

The provider also reviewed the effectiveness of ongoing training for all staff. They strengthened their risk assessment training to ensure that this informs all staff's practice. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

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Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the

enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
