

# Inspection of Camp Beaumont - St Helen's

## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Leaders discuss how they place the safety of children at the centre of what they do. For example, they talk about the comprehensive training they provide for staff. They describe how staff use this to keep children safe and well. Leaders are secure in their understanding of what may cause them concern about the welfare of a child attending the club. There are clear procedures to follow if they, or staff, have any concerns. There are robust recruitment procedures in place to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children.
- Supporting children with special educational needs and/or disabilities to access the club is important to leaders. They explain how they gather comprehensive information from parents and/or carers. Leaders discuss how this supports staff in meeting the individual needs of children attending the club. Staff are trained in how to motivate and engage all children. For instance, leaders describe how they have introduced picture cards to help children communicate with staff. Leaders say they work hard to create an inclusive and enjoyable atmosphere for all children.
- Leaders understand that not all children have the same advantages. They describe how they provide a rich variety of experiences for children, such as clay workshops, nature trails, swimming and a wide variety of games, books and toys.
- Leaders describe how staff have high expectations for children's behaviour. They discuss how they have introduced a 'club contract'. This focuses on children having positive attitudes to each other, appreciating their differences and caring for others. Children's happiness is important to leaders.
- Leaders say children's mental and emotional well-being is at the heart of the club. They describe how staff encourage children to take part in physical activity. For example, they play tennis and have space to run around. Leaders say they are also aware that children need time to sit quietly and relax during a busy day. They discuss how staff provide areas where children can explore sensory toys or read books.
- Leaders describe how they support children in developing healthy attitudes to food. For instance, they talk about how staff will play games with children to help them develop an interest in fruit and vegetables.
- Leaders emphasise how they work closely with families to create a two-way flow of information. They talk about how they provide boards with core information on them. These are displayed prominently for parents to see. Leaders talk about how they gather the views of parents and children. They discuss how they use these to reflect on the service they provide. Leaders also describe how they gather the views of staff and talk to them about how they would like to develop resources and activities.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Camp Beaumont - St Helen's registered in 2004. The independently-owned club operates from St Helen's School in Northwood, in the London Borough of Hillingdon. The club operates from 8am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, during school holidays. There are 45 members of childcare staff. Of these, five hold relevant qualifications from level 3 to level 6.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed a sample of the documentation that leaders use in the club. This included the checks they carry out to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children.
- Leaders talked about how they support staff, including developing their skills and knowledge.
- Leaders discussed how they reflect on the service provided by the club for children and parents. They talked about how they gather the views of parents and children.
- The inspector talked to leaders about the activities provided for children and how they, and staff, support children's well-being. Leaders discussed their expectations for children's behaviour while attending the club.
- Leaders talked about how the premises are used and about the activities provided for children, both indoors and outdoors.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
