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Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Following an incident relating to the supervision of children, the provider took action to meet requirements. Leaders ensure that the premises are safe and that staff understand their roles and responsibilities. They understand the importance of supervising children closely at all times.
- The provider works closely with leaders to ensure the smooth running of the club. Leaders implement robust recruitment and vetting procedures to help ensure that staff are suitable to care for children. There are secure systems in place to provide staff with ongoing support and opportunities for professional development to contribute towards continually improving their practice.
- Leaders and staff understand the importance of engaging with parents and school staff to share important information to meet children's needs and support their well-being. They also understand the value of involving parents and children in the self-evaluation process to continually improve children's play experiences.
- Leaders recognise the importance of helping children to learn positive behaviours and respect for each other. They understand how to encourage staff to set clear boundaries for behaviour to promote a respectful and positive culture for any child who may attend.
- Leaders understand the importance of helping children to develop personal skills, confidence and independence through their activities, routines and interactions. They explain the importance of offering children healthy food choices and exercise to help them learn about being healthy.
- The staff team understands how to provide enjoyable play experiences and routines for children. They recognise the importance of planning and providing play opportunities that children like to join in with. They know how to provide inclusive care for all children to help them feel settled and happy.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Information about this early years setting

Mytime Active Breakfast and After School Club at Alexandra Juniors registered in 2018. The club is independently run but on a school premises. It is one of several out-of-school and holiday clubs run by the same provider. The club is open each weekday, during term-time only. The breakfast club operates from 7.30am to 9am, and the after-school club runs from 3.20pm to 6pm. There are six staff who currently work with the children. Of these, the manager holds a relevant qualification at level 6.

Inspection activities

- We carried out this inspection as a result of a risk assessment, following information we received about the provider.
- Although there were no children in the early age range present at the time of this inspection, there were children present who were over the age of five years.
- The manager showed the inspector around the areas of the premises used for childcare and discussed how they ensure that these areas are safe and suitable.
- The inspector spoke to the manager and the staff at convenient times to gain information about how they implement care practices and routines.
- The manager showed the inspector documentation to demonstrate the suitability of staff.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
