

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage (EYFS). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 3 April 2025 the provider notified Ofsted that a child had sustained an injury to their hand that required emergency medical treatment.

The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event.

On 14 May 2025 we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit to the setting. We found that the provider had revised procedures for dealing with significant accidents but that these were not sufficiently clear and had yet to be shared with all staff. In addition, we found that written records of accidents or injuries and the first aid treatment given to children were not consistently completed in accordance with the club's procedures, or accurately maintained.

We have issued a Notice to Improve. The provider must take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Action required by 28 May 2025

- Review procedures for dealing with accidents or injuries and ensure that the first aid box has the appropriate items for use on children. Ensure any revised procedures are known to all staff. Ensure that written records of accidents or injuries and the first aid treatment given are consistently completed in accordance with the club's procedures and accurately maintained.
- Review procedures for obtaining and recording information about each child. Ensure that information obtained about each child is accurate and up to date and known to all staff. Ensure it includes information about any person who has parental responsibility for the child and which parent/carer the child normally lives with.

We will monitor the provider response to the Notice to Improve.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
