## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Leaders demonstrate a good understanding of how to organise the club. They work closely with the host school to plan experiences that complement what children learn at school. The club offers a broad range of activities based on children's needs and interests. Leaders help children to complete their homework and access story books to enhance their learning.
- The procedures for promoting positive behaviour are well thought out. Leaders discuss how children devise their own club rules to help them feel a sense of ownership. Staff attend behaviour management training and focus on helping children to express their feelings and emotions. Unwanted behaviour is managed sensitively and consistently, which helps children to learn about what is expected.
- Leaders help young children to settle at the club by providing them with a key person that they know well. All staff currently work in the host school and are with children daily. They have a good understanding of children's needs and interests, which helps them to plan experiences that they enjoy.
- Leaders recognise the importance of promoting children's good health and well-being. They provide a range of healthy snacks and discuss how they manage children's allergies. Children have access to a large and well-equipped outdoor area that they use each day. Leaders recognise the benefits of exercise and provide children with a range of gym equipment and bicycles to build their physical skills.
- Leaders discuss how they help children to develop their independence at the club. For instance, children serve their own snack, use knives to spread butter onto their toast, clean their plates and help to complete the daily checklists. Older children are assigned as 'buddies' to younger children to help them develop their confidence when doing things for themselves.
- The procedures for supervision, coaching and mentoring are embedded. Leaders understand their responsibility to help staff build their knowledge and skills. Staff receive one-to-one meetings and ongoing feedback on their performance. They access professional development opportunities, such as training, to help them in their role.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
