## Summary of key findings

### This provision does not meet requirements

- Discussion with leaders and staff outlines a weakness in safeguarding arrangements. Although they can describe the signs and symptoms of child abuse, they are unsure what they will do if they have a safeguarding concern. Furthermore, the safeguarding policy does not contain the procedure to follow if an allegation is made against a member of staff. This means the safety of children is at risk.
- Leaders explain that all staff work at the same school that the children attend, and strong relationships are fostered. Staff attend training that relates to their roles within the school setting. However, effective induction and professional development arrangements for staff, that are specific to meet the needs of the children attending this setting, are not in place. Therefore, children's well-being is not assured.
- Staff describe how children learn about healthy eating. They discuss how children and staff sit together at snack time and engage in conversations about what food is healthy.
- Staff explain the different ways in which they promote children's confidence and self-esteem. Staff state that they engage in purposeful conversations to acknowledge children's ideas and experiences and use kind words and actions to praise children in the setting.
- Staff discuss how they teach children the importance of good hygiene routines. They outline how children are reminded to wash their hands and share antibacterial gel to cleanse their hands before they eat.
- Staff describe how they plan activities that they know children will enjoy. They state that they acknowledge children's ideas and experiences and encourage them to make independent choices in their play.
- Staff explain how they promote positive behaviour with praise when children share, take turns and help with routine tasks. Staff discuss how they promote children's free choice and support them to discuss and resolve minor disagreements amicably.
- Staff share how they help children to respect resources and the environment. They talk about how they implement regular routines where children safely help to set up tables and chairs at the beginning of the session and how they encourage children to tidy away activities to keep the environment safe.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### What does the setting need to do to improve?

**To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:**
