Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Through discussion, leaders explain how they plan to provide a play environment that includes all children. They talk about the various themes they plan and how staff structure the club sessions. Leaders describe how this helps children to have access to a range of play experiences.
- Leaders and staff understand how to promote children's health. For example, they explain how they plan to support children's understanding of hygiene and provide nutritious snacks for children to enjoy.
- Leaders understand how to support children's behaviour. They discuss their previous experience of working in partnership with children's school and implement similar strategies to support children's behaviour. Staff discuss how they plan to help children to agree the rules of the club, to help them to understand the expectations for their behaviour.
- Leaders know the importance of maintaining communication with parents and carers and the school that children attend. They explain how this helps them to understand about children's backgrounds and individual needs. Leaders understand how to use this information to help children to settle in the club.
- Leaders talk about how they carry out regular audits on the club to ensure that appropriate resources and staffing are in place. They also use feedback from children, parents and staff to inform their evaluations of the quality of the provision.
- Leaders have a good understanding of the requirements of registration. They keep themselves up to date with any changes, such as legislation and safeguarding updates.
- Leaders have robust recruitment procedures and supervision sessions in place, to ensure that staff are suitable for their role. They discuss the policies and procedures that are in place and understand these well. Leaders recognise the importance of planning for staff to go on training opportunities, to enhance their professional development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
