## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Staff understand that creating warm and nurturing relationships with children is important. They discuss strategies to encourage children to express themselves. When children encounter emotional challenges, staff know it is important to encourage them to share these where appropriate. Staff want children to feel heard and listened to. Staff recognise that this helps children to feel confident and emotionally secure.
- Staff understand how to create activities that consider children's interests. For example, they talk about how board games help children to practise skills and cooperate with each other. Staff understand that playing games like chess helps children to concentrate and persevere.
- Staff consider children's physical health well. They know how to plan a wide variety of sporting activities and games that help promote children's coordination and strength. Staff want children to feel excited to learn the rules to new games. They understand that sports help children to develop physical strength and stamina.
- Leaders demonstrate an understanding of how to train staff. They discuss how regular supervisions with staff help to identify training opportunities. Leaders know that helping staff to identify gaps in their knowledge is important. They understand that this helps staff to learn new strategies to support children.
- Staff know that providing healthy foods is important. Staff discuss how they consider what children like and dislike. Staff create a menu of well-balanced and healthy meals. They know that spacing out mealtimes in their routine helps children to have plenty of opportunities to eat during sessions. They understand that this promotes children's physical health.
- Leaders and staff understand how to communicate effectively with parents. They have procedures in place to share experiences with parents. They know how to provide information to parents about any updates or changes to the sessions.
- Staff understand how to promote children's behaviour. They demonstrate an understanding of how to use a range of strategies to help children to understand expectations. For example, staff discuss how positive reinforcement helps children to take pride in positive behaviours.
- Staff understand how to supervise children during mealtimes. They have procedures in place to respond to medical emergencies. Leaders regularly review policies that help keep children safe. They know that regular training helps staff to understand what policies mean for their practice.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
