

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 October 2025, the provider notified us about an incident relating to concerns about children's safety and welfare, qualifications, training, support and skills, suitable people and health. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 6 November 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued an action for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 17 November 2025:

- ensure at least half of the staff working with babies have received training that specifically addresses the care needs of babies.

On 17 November 2025, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of staff:child ratios and taken steps to ensure adequate staff members have received appropriate and specific training addressing the care needs of babies. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised. Also, on 17 November 2025, the provider notified us of a further incident relating to staff:child ratios and training and skills. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 25 November 2025, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. They have re-visited key training with staff, strengthened systems for head counting children and improved the supervision of children at transition times. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
