

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 3 October 2025, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to Staff: child ratios.

On 11 November 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 25 November 2025:

- ensure staff: child ratios are maintained at all times to keep children safe
- ensure babies are seated safely in a highchair or appropriate low chair when eating to keep children safe
- senior leaders must ensure that leaders understand the requirements of the Early years foundation stage and support them to implement these into practice

On 23 December 2025, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of staff: child ratios and had implemented procedures to make these more robust. Children sit in appropriate chairs for all meals and snack to ensure they are safe. Leaders have ensured those responsible for oversight of the nursery have the skills and knowledge to do so. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply

with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
