## Introduction

## **Description of the school**

Triangle Nursery is situated in a local authority housing estate in Lambeth. Children come from this and a larger estate nearby as well as from more affluent, privately owned homes. About half the children are learning English as an additional language and 22 different languages are represented in the school. The nursery offers some family support services and has specialist funding to develop the creative curriculum. An acting headteacher and deputy are currently in post.

## **Quality of provision**

### **Teaching and learning**

#### Grade:

Teaching and learning are outstanding. Planning is detailed, thorough and closely tailored to the individual needs of children. As a result they make significant progress. Staff use language exceptionally well which helps children to learn new vocabulary and ways of talking. An exemplary feature is the use of more than one language during sessions. Bilingual children learn to switch from one to the other with ease. Encouraged by stories read by parents and staff in different languages, children try to speak a little of each. Activities planned for children are usually exciting and readily engage their interest. Staff make outstanding use of external and internal areas for imaginative play and children love pretending, for example, to be a travel agent. Questioning is often very good, but occasionally children need more time to think about an answer. Some quieter children need to be encouraged to give their own explanations. Teaching takes very good account of learning difficulties or where children need to be challenged more. Their progress is rigorously assessed and they and their parents are provided with regular and high quality feedback.

## **Curriculum and other activities**

#### Grade:

Curricular provision is outstanding. Planning tailors work exceptionally well to individual interests and needs and ensures excellent coverage of the curriculum. Staff keep a close eye on activities that children participate in and this ensures that each benefits from a broad range of experiences. Children learn to collaborate, use their initiative, solve problems, work independently and think creatively as a result. Provision for children with learning difficulties and English as an additional language is excellent. The strong emphasis on children's home languages supports their progress exceptionally well. Creative projects in partnership with other institutions enhance children's creative development and have had the added impact of strengthening their concentration spans. Almost all activities contribute to children's literacy and language, mathematical and personal development. Daily access to computers means children quickly pick up skills in new technology which prepares them well for the next stage in their education. They learn about healthy lifestyles, personal safety and the world of work. Visitors to the school and trips to places of interest extend children's experiences well.

### Care, guidance and support

#### Grade:

Care, guidance and support are excellent. Children are very well looked after and procedures for child protection and health and safety are very good. The key worker system, where every child is attached to a specific member of staff, is very effective in ensuring that the personal and academic needs of each child are outstandingly well met and provides an excellent link between home and school.

Assessment is very thorough and staff work incredibly hard to keep detailed but informative records of progress. Clear targets are set for improvement based on assessments and observations of individual children. These include specific targets for those with special educational needs or English as an additional language.
