The family learning provision sampled (one session) during my one-day visit at Portsmouth City Council is outstanding. I agreed to provide a summary of the good practice seen and to identify some areas for development, and I outline the main findings as bulleted points below.

The main strengths are:

- very effective strategic linking of family learning provision into local and regional priorities
- very good development of learners' skills and knowledge
- particularly effective consultation and recruitment strategies
- very effective partnerships to meet the needs of families at risk
- well developed systems for gathering a wide range of progression evidence
- very flexible provision to ensure effective literacy and numeracy outcomes

Areas for further development

• improve the operational team's confidence in the use of data
